




## A Thank You Note to All from Fr. John

# ANNOUNCEMENT OF EASTER AND THE MOVEABLE FEASTS FOR 2024

Pastor's Note: The Proclamation of the date of Easter and the other moveable feasts usually occurs at the Masses on the Feast of the Epiphany, which was last Sunday, January 7. This Proclamation was announced at some but not at all of the Masses here at St. Michael's last weekend. The custom of making this Proclamation on Epiphany Sunday dates from an ancient time when calendars were not readily available. It was necessary to make known the date of Easter in advance, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on its date. The number of Sundays that follow Epiphany, the date of Ash Wednesday, and the number of Sundays that follow Pentecost are all computed in relation to Easter. Although calendars now give the date of Easter and the other feasts in the liturgical year for many years in advance, the Epiphany Proclamation still has value. It is a reminder of the centrality of the Resurrection of the Lord in the liturgical year and the importance of the great mysteries of faith which are celebrated each year.

Know, dear brothers and sisters, that, as we have rejoiced at the Nativity of our Lord Jesus Christ, so by leave of God's mercy we announce to you also the joy of his Resurrection, who is our Savior. And so, let it be known that:

On the fourteenth day of February will fall Ash Wednesday, and the beginning of the fast of the most sacred Lenten season.

On the thirty-first day of March we will celebrate with joy Easter Day, the Paschal feast of our Lord Jesus Christ.

[In those places where the Ascension is transferred to the Seventh Sunday of Easter:] On the twelfth day of May (a <u>Sunday</u> now in our Diocese of Trenton) will be the Ascension of our Lord Jesus Christ.

On the nineteenth day of May, the feast of Pentecost.

On the second day of June, the feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

On the first day of December, the First Sunday of the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ, to whom is honor and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Bishop O'Connell has been hospitalized since Jan. 4 after undergoing emergency cardiac surgery to open a blocked artery. The Bishop had been in Rome a few days ahead of the arrival of some 20 priests of the Diocese for a planned pilgrimage.



In a brief communication with The Monitor Jan. 7, Bishop O'Connell expressed gratitude for all the prayers and good wishes he is receiving and says he is feeling better each day. He looks forward to returning home as soon as possible.

The Bishop added that although he misses being with the priests on pilgrimage, he is very happy that they are enjoying their visit to Rome.






- "There are those who presume to offer dishonorable solutions indeed; they do not recoil even from the taking of life." (Gaudium et Spes, 51:2
- "For God, the Lord of life, has conferred on men the surpassing ministry of safe-guarding life in a manner which is worthy of man. Therefore from the moment of its conception life must be guarded with the greatest care while abortion and infanticide are unspeakable crimes. (Gaudium et Spes, 51:3 quoted at Catechism 2271)
- The Catechism of the Catholic Church:
- <u>Paragraph 2270</u>: "Human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception. From the first moment of his existence, a human being must be recognized as having the rights of a person among which is the inviolable right of every innocent being to life."
- <u>Paragraph 2271</u>: "Since the first century the Church has affirmed the moral evil of every procured abortion. This teaching has not changed and remains unchangeable. Direct abortion, that is to say, abortion willed either as an end or a means, is gravely contrary to the moral law."





terror, anxiety, and dread but is best understood as an appropriate response of respect and awe directed toward God – in a word "REVERENCE" toward God – and in turn resulting in "reverence for LIFE" – human life created by God in the image and likeness of God. The sound bite can be reduced to and summarized in these few words: REVERENCE for God and REVERENCE for the moral law written by God on the hearts of men and women (Jeremiah 31:33-34) and REVERENCE for LIFE. Reverence for life and reverence for the GOSPEL of LIFE proclaimed by Jesus Himself that can be publicly and visibly WITNESSED by you and me at the Rally and March in Washington; as Pope Benedict wrote in one of the quotations set forth above: "It is necessary to witness concretely that respect for life is the first form of justice....For those who have the gift of faith this becomes a mandatory imperative, because the disciple of Christ is called to be increasingly a "prophet" of a truth [and a witness of Truth] that can never be eliminated: God alone is the Lord of life. Every person is known and loved, wanted and guided by Him."
