BAPTISMS





St. Michael's Church: Parish News of Mid-January

<u>Parish "Mass for Life" on Friday, January 21</u>. We will celebrate a Parish Mass for Life on Friday, January 21, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. in the Upper Church – the same day that the Rally for Life and the March for Life will be taking place in Washington, DC. All are invited and welcome to attend this Mass for Life. Further details on Page 6.

Covid "Pop Up" Vaccination Clinic at St. Michael's. A covid vaccination "pop up" clinic will be conducted at St. Michael's in the Lower Church for seven consecutive days from Sunday, January 16 through and including Saturday, January 22. BOTH the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines will be available free of charge. Exact hours of each day's vaccination availability are listed on Page 5 of this bulletin and on the parish website. Similar vaccination clinics were conducted here at the parish on three occasions during 2021. First doses, second doses, and booster/third doses will be available. Receiving the covid vaccination has been approved and encouraged by our Holy Father Pope Francis, our Holy Father Emeritus Pope Benedict, our Bishop David O'Connell, and our parish priests Fr. John and Fr. Mark – all of whom have been vaccinated. If not already covid vaccinated, please prayerfully consider vaccination unless a medical or strong religious or other strong reason guides you otherwise.

Extra Sunday Mass for Covid-Vaccinated and Face Masked. We have added – temporarily – an extra Sunday Mass to our weekend schedule beginning on Sunday, January 9 at 5:30 p.m. At this Mass all will be required to please follow ALL THREE of the following: (a) have been covid-vaccinated at least once, (b) wear a face-mask throughout the Mass except to consume the Eucharist, and (c) receive Communion on the hand only and not on the tongue. Covid vaccination verification cards will NOT be required at this Mass....the honor system will be relied on. One covid vaccination is sufficient for attending this Mass, although the second and third vaccinations are strongly encouraged and preferred. If one is ill or experiencing covid symptoms or symptoms of other illness – as has been requested/recommended in the past – please remain at home. At our other Masses here at St. Michael's we have been following and we will continue to follow the guidelines of the State and Diocese: • vaccinations strongly encouraged (not required), • facemasks strongly encouraged (not required), • frequent handwashing strongly encouraged, • Communion on the hand (per the Diocese; the State is silent of course on this point) strongly encouraged (not required). With regard to Holy Communion, receiving on the hand and not on the tongue at ALL Masses is VERY, VERY, VERY strongly encouraged until we are all out of the covid woods (and required on the hand at the Sunday 5:30 Mass referred to above). Please pray that the date of emerging from the covid woods is soon!

Outdoor Holy Communion at Two Masses Temporarily. As part of our effort to work through the omicron surge (some are now calling it the "omicron tsunami"....the covid statistics at the nearby hospitals are staggering and sobering; please pray for the patients, hospital staff, and all caregivers) and without over-reacting and with the balancing of numerous factors and limited resources and manpower and womanpower as best we can, Holy Communion will be available in the parking lot in your cars after the Saturday 4:00 indoor Mass and after the Sunday 10:00 indoor Mass beginning on Saturday the 8th and Sunday the 9th for those who attend and participate at those Masses in their cars by means of the live-stream transmission of the indoor Mass being celebrated at those hours. The radio transmission of the audio of these two Masses on station 92.1 FM will not be available because of equipment and technical reasons; the audio and video live-stream transmission of these two Masses may be accessed on your iphone, tablet, or other similar devices (in your car or elsewhere) via the parish website www.stmichaelnj.com and the parish YouTube Channel. The priest/celebrant of these two Masses will be indoors as he celebrates the Mass and not on the stage near the garage in the parking lot. This plan will remain in effect until further notice and is temporary and is of course subject to inclement weather (e.g. winter snow or extreme cold) that would put the health of the Mass-goers, the Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, ushers, parking lot staff, and priests at risk.

Parish Office Hours and Office Covid Protocols Modified. Our parish business office and all parish staff will be following guidelines recently issued by our Diocese for the Diocese Chancery Office staff members and Chancery Office visitors as an omicron precaution. The parish office staff will alternate days in the office and days working at home through the end of January. Mary or Susan will be in the office on all weekdays during usual business hours from January 10 through the end of January. Office hours will be re-evaluated in light of covid/omicron/etc. and published at the end of this month. All office visitors are asked to please wear face masks while visiting the parish office until further notice.


Office Closed; Martin Luther King, Jr. Day


pointment necessary. No need to provide identification documentation or insurance documentation. No impact on immigration status. First come, first served. For those unable to

Please pray for a swift and complete end to the Covid-19 pandemic, for the recovery of those who are ill with this virus, and for the safety and perseverance of their caregivers.

You are encouraged to bring to this clinic your COVID vaccination verification documentation if you have already received Dose #1 and or Dose #2. But that verification is NOT REQUIRED at this clinic. Prior verification vaccination documentation is NOT NECESSARY at this clinic.

At the request of His Eminence Wilton Cardinal Gregory, Archbishop of Washington, the Apostolic Signatura of the Holy See imparts a plenary indulgence

To those who physically take part in sacred celebrations connected with the annual "March for Life" in Washington, DC on January 20 and 21 2022;

To the aged, sick and those who cannot be physically present for a grave reason but who are able to spiritually participate from home through any/all media presentations.

The usual conditions apply:

A disposition of detachment from any kind of sin;

Sacramental confession (on January 20-21, 2022 or within 20 days)

Reception of Eucharistic Communion (on January 20-21, 2022 or within 20 days)

Prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father (on January 20-21, 2022 or within 20 days).

The plenary indulgence may be applied to the person seeking it or for the holy souls in purgatory. It is valid for this event only: January 20-21, 2022 "March for Life" sacred ceremonies.




For An End to Abortion:

- In the event of inclement weather the Rosary will be moved to the Upper Church.








NOVENA TO ST. JOSEPH TO END ABORTION January 13-21, 2022




