# How does a listening session work?

All parishioners and community members are invited to participate in one listening session at their schedule's convenience.

A listening session is a small group session comprised of a facilitator, note taker, and between six and eight participants. These sessions will last a little over an hour. The facilitator will lead the session, posing the primary Synod question: What are the joys or consolations and the difficulties or obstacles of our journeying together as a church and faith community?

Participants will individually share their stories first, and then the participants will be asked to reflect on the stories they have heard from others in the session. After this moment of reflection, the participants will be asked about what moved, touched, or resonated with them. The purpose is not to agree or disagree with one another, but to listen and be moved by the Holy Spirit. Finally, the participants will be asked to share how they feel the Spirit guiding is them to be Church in the future.

The note taker will capture these stories, but not the names of the participants. Notes from each session will be forwarded to the Diocese. The Diocese will in turn, assemble the responses from all the listening sessions throughout the parishes of the Diocese of Trenton in a summary for use at the United States Bishop's Conference. The US Bishop's Conference will then compile their collective summaries to be forwarded to Rome.

Extra Sunday Mass for Covid-Vaccinated and Face Masked. We have added – temporarily – an extra Sunday Mass to our weekend schedule which began on Sunday, January 9 at 5:30 p.m. At *this* Mass *all* will be *re*quired to please follow ALL THREE of the following: (a) have been covid-vaccinated at least once, (b) wear a facemask throughout the Mass except to consume the Eucharist, and (c) receive Communion on the hand only and not on the tongue. Covid vaccination verification cards will NOT be required at this Mass....the honor system will be relied on. One covid vaccination is sufficient for attending this Mass, although the second and third vaccinations are strongly encouraged and preferred. If one is ill or experiencing covid symptoms or symptoms of other illness - as has been requested/recommended in the past - please remain at home. At our other Masses here at St. Michael's we have been following and we will continue to follow the guidelines of the State and Diocese: • vaccinations strongly encouraged (not required), • facemasks strongly encouraged (not required), • frequent handwashing strongly encouraged, • Communion on the hand (per the Diocese; the State is silent of course on this point) strongly encouraged (not required). With regard to Holy Communion, receiving on the hand and not on the tongue at ALL Masses is VERY, VERY, VERY strongly encouraged until we are all out of the covid woods (and required on the hand at the Sunday 5:30 Mass referred to above). Please pray that the date of emerging from the covid woods is soon!

# Outdoor Holy Communion at Two Masses

Temporarily. As part of our effort to work through the omicron surge (some have been calling it the "omicron tsunami"....the covid statistics at the nearby hospitals have been staggering and sobering; please pray for the patients, hospital staff, and all caregivers) and without over-reacting and with the balancing of numerous factors and limited resources and manpower and womanpower as best we can, Holy Communion will be available in the parking lot in your cars after the Saturday 4:00 indoor Mass and after the Sunday 10:00 indoor Mass beginning on Saturday, January 8th and Sunday, January 9th for those who attend and participate at those Masses in their cars by means of the live-stream transmission of the indoor Mass being celebrated at those hours. The radio transmission of the audio of these two Masses on station 92.1 FM will not be available because of equipment and technical reasons; the audio and video live-stream transmission of these two Masses may be accessed on your i-phone, tablet, or other similar devices (in car or elsewhere) via the parish www.stmichaelnj.com and the parish YouTube Channel. The priest/celebrant of these two Masses will be indoors as he celebrates the Mass and not on the stage near the garage in the parking lot. This plan will remain in effect until further notice and is temporary and is of course subject to inclement weather (e.g. winter snow or extreme cold) that would put the health of the Mass-goers, the Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, ushers, parking lot staff, and priests at risk. As Holy Communion is made available post-Mass in the parking lot in this extraordinary way to meet sacramental needs and to satisfy health and safety concerns during the ongoing pandemic, please keep in mind and observe the utmost reverence for the Blessed Sacrament and the utmost respect for the sacredness and dignity of



# Holy Hours for Life on 1st and 22nd of the Month



The Supreme Court's decision in the *Roe vs. Wade* case was issued on the **22nd of the month** in January 1973.

The Supreme Court heard the oral argument in the *Dobbs vs. Jackson* case (the case that we pray will overrule *Roe vs. Wade* or at least substantially cutback on *Roe* and substantially increase the protection of the unborn) on the *1st of the month* in December 2021.

The Supreme Court's decision in the *Dobbs* case is likely to be issued in June of this year or perhaps sooner.

During the coming months as we anticipate the *Dobbs* decision, we will conduct a *Holy Hour for Life* on the *Ist day and the 22nd day of each month beginning on February 1st*. This Holy Hour will take place twice on

each of these days – immediately after the conclusion of the 8:00 a.m. Daily Mass until 9:30 a.m. and again in the evening of each of these days from 6:45 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. Each Holy Hour for Life will include Eucharistic Adoration, Scripture reading, reflection/homily, Rosary, and Benediction. All are invited and welcome. Please pray for an end to abortion; for reconciliation, conversion, and healing; and for compassionate and competent care for women during and after crisis pregnancy. St. Michael, pray for us.

# A CALL FOR PRAYER ON THE WORLD DAY OF THE SICK: Friday, February 11



If you have an interest or desire to read at Mass, please consider joining our Altar Service Ministry as a Lector.



# Earthquake Relief in Haiti; Special Appeal on Feb. 12 –13

Dear St. Michael's Parishioners and Visitors:

During the weekend of February 12-13 we will be welcoming to St. Michael's Church Fr. Paul Janvier, SVD (of Mount Carmel Church and Mother of Mercy Parish in Asbury Park) and Fr. Jean Felicien, a par-



ish priest and canon lawyer of our Diocese of Trenton. Fr. Paul and Fr. Jean were born and raised in Haiti and have been ministering to the people of the Diocese of Trenton for many years. They will be with us next weekend to tell us about the extraordinary death toll, injuries, and property damage suffered in Haiti as the result of the magnitude 7.2 earthquake that struck the southern portion of the country on August 14 of last year. That earthquake damaged or destroyed hundreds of churches, including the local parish church of St. Francis de Sales in the Town of



Since many of our parishioners and weekend visitors did not have access to the January 30 bulletin, we are re-printing some of the key items from that bulletin in this the February 6 edition including Mr. Kevin Connelly's outstanding D.R.E. Letter below.

Traditions are something handed down from previous generations. Some traditions have endured for thousands of years profoundly influencing human relationships and the development of civilized societies. "Good" traditions not only connect us to our ancestral past, they continue to enrich and unite us in every-day relationships. They remain relevant because authentic traditions and symbols permeate the soul with truths beyond mere verbal communication. "Good" traditions bind humanity together which is why Satan wants us to forget or destroy them. Sacred Tradition, which recalls the movement of God the Holy Spirit in history and in the lives of the people of God, is especially despised by the Evil One.

You don't need me to tell you that our country's traditions and symbols are under malicious assault, but perhaps you do not equally realize that our Catholic traditions are under the same pernicious attack, albeit by more covert methods (at least for the time being.) It would be hard to argue that the awareness of our Holy Days, especially our Holy Seasons, have not been dissipated by neglect, lack of interest and sometimes commercialism. The Twelve Days of Christmas, the Epiphany, the Baptism of Our Lord, the Annunciation, the Easter Triduum, the Ascension, Pentecost, Corpus Christi, the Transfiguration, the Assumption, All Saints Day, the Immaculate Conception and other days of profound significance and joy, so worthy of being honored and celebrated, are instead "oh-hums" to many of us Catholics.



In the big scheme of things, does it really make much of a difference that these Holy Days fade away? If you care about the quality of your life it does. We are losing out on the deep meaning, understanding and direction worthy traditions and symbols offer to our lives. They provide another channel of God's communication to us and in the bonding of people into community. It is no coincidence that with the loss of positive social and religious traditions violence, intolerance and apathy are on the rise in our world. With just a little reflection on the growing chaos in our society, it becomes apparent that our disregarded positive traditions are a much-needed source for actual Peace on Earth and Good Will to All because they help us to honor the sacred, see truth and to care about each other. The customs and rituals that make up our traditions aren't mere niceties, they are something we truly need!

On February 2<sup>nd</sup>, forty days after Christmas, we come to the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, also known as the Purification of Mary, the Holy Encounter and Candlemas. This tradition is linked as far back as Moses, (14 centuries before Christ and 26 centuries before our present time) although it took on a new and fuller meaning with Jesus. And while it is not in the season, it is the last Christmas feast of the liturgical calendar as we commemorate Christ the infant child.

More than just interesting, it is the substance that the Presentation holds for us today that makes it important in our lives. In a world crying for purification, liberation and deliverance from darkness, Mary and Joseph went to offer Jesus to God in the Temple at Jerusalem. Here they encountered Simeon, an elderly and holy man. Taking Jesus in his arms Simeon exclaims: Now, Master, you can dismiss your servant in peace; you have fulfilled your word. For my eyes have witnessed your saving deed, displayed for all the peoples to see: A revealing light to the Gentiles, the glory of your people Israel

Simeon is saying to <u>us</u>, Listen up! God keeps His promises and Jesus, the Messiah, our Priest, Lord and Savior, has come to be the revealing light for all humanity. Right now, in real time, our world seems to be darkening and we need the reassurance of Simeon's words that Jesus will dispel sin and darkness and even in troubling times we can be at peace. We need to be reminded that we have been presented at baptism, becoming a Christian dedicated to God. At that time, we received a candle lit from the Paschal Candle and told, You have been enlightened by Christ. Walk always as children of the light and keep the flame of faith alive in your heart.

This Candlemas, let us look upon a lighted blessed candle and be inspired, be excited by the profound understanding of what Christ has done for us and can do in us.

As an aside, you may have realized that February 2 is also known as Groundhog Day. However, it really began long ago as *If Candlemas be fair and bright, Come, Winter, have another flight. If Candlemas brings clouds and rain, Go, Winter, and come not again.* In America, Protestants decided we should replace the Catholic Candlemas Day. It's time to take it back.


