BAPTISMS





Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,





During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 until Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021* --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. The pastor of a parish has the authority to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish. The Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, April 20-21, 2021 to Trinity Sunday, May 30, 2021. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

May our Lenten journeys nourish our minds and hearts, strengthen us against the chains of sin, and bring us closer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

No Soup & Salad Suppers This Year/Lent as a Covid-19 Precaution

Sad to say that this year – this Lent 2021 – we will not be conducting the Soup & Salad Suppers that have preceded Stations of the Cross the past several years/Lents on Friday evenings here at St. Michael's. We are taking this action in the abundance of caution that has characterized much of our lives and decisions recently. The fellowship, camaraderie, and prayerfulness that have marked our pre-Stations suppers will be missed but they will hopefully return in abundance next year. Stations of the Cross will be prayed every Friday night of Lent beginning on February 19 and continuing through Good Friday. *Please note the new and earlier starting time of* 7:00 p.m. (not 7:30) this year.



Ash Wednesday Children's and Family Mass

will be celebrated on Ash Wednesday, February 17 at 5:30 P.M. for all children and their families and friends. All are welcome. Begin this Lenten season with your child and make this a Lent to remember!!!

ASH WEDNESDAY MASS SCHEDULE

On Ash Wednesday, February 17 Masses are as follows:

8:00 A.M. Mass 12:15 P.M. Mass

4:00 P.M. Mass *(Parking Lot; Live-Stream)* 5:30 P.M. Mass (Children's & Family Mass) 7:00 P.M. Mass

Ashes will be imposed at all five Masses on Ash Wednesday. The 5:30 p.m. Mass on Ash Wednesday will focus on the parish's children and families; all are welcome and invited to that Mass.

Bishop O'Connell - - with everyone's health and safety in mind on Ash Wednesday and during Lent - - has directed parishes to continue following all covid protocols during Lent and to please be mindful of the following:

- The Church has *never obliged* attendance at Mass nor the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday. Ash Wednesday is not a holy day of obligation this year nor has it been in the past.
- Imposing ashes in the usual manner is not permitted this year.
- Recommended Method: marking the foreheads of the faithful with ashes *with the use of a QTip.*
- A new QTip must be used with every person (as currently done with Anointings of the Sick).
- Sprinkling of ashes on the top of the head (the "Roman custom") is not customary in the U.S. and is inadvisable.
- Priests and, only if necessary, other ministers shall sanitize hands before and after imposition of ashes.
- Ashes are to blessed after the homily of the Mass. They will be imposed at the conclusion of the Mass prior to the departure of the faithful.

From the Pastor's Desk Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Michael's Church:

This weekend of February 14 and 15 is Pledge Weekend for this year's Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) throughout the Diocese of Trenton. Each year Bishop O'Connell seeks the support of all of the members of the Diocese of Trenton to further the work of our ministries. Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to

the Annual Catholic Appeal. Our single Act of Faith propels the works of love that build up our Church. You make that happen with a generous gift to the ACA. Please read the Bishop's ACA letter published above.

This year St. Michael's share of the Diocesan-wide goal is \$109,000 (the same goal as in the past eleven years and the goal that we achieved last year and the two years before that for the first times). As the result of reaching our parish ACA goal in each of those three most recent years we not only strongly supported the Diocese in its ministries and charitable works and demonstrated our commitment to stewardship and charitable giving, our parish also gained the financial reward of a \$23,000 rebate in 2018 and a \$16,500 rebate in each of 2019 and 2020. Those ACA rebate funds were utilized for the Lower Church restrooms renovation project, church foundation water-proofing and repairs, CCD/education materials, Covid-related upgrades to the Lower Church's ventilation equipment, and buildings and grounds repairs. The 2020 ACA rebate was also used in part to fund ordinary operating expenses since - as we all know - the parish's revenue from Sunday collections and the Easter and Christmas collections was significantly depleted in 2020 due to the pandemic and reduced in-church Mass attendance.

I have proposed to the parish trustees and finance council that if St. Michael's is successful again in achieving the parish's \$109,000 ACA goal and earns and receives a rebate of \$16,000 or more that the parish use those rebate funds for: (a) upgrades to the air filtration/ventilation system and equipment in the Upper Church (including a state-of-the-





art germicidal, ultra-violet light air purifier), (b) improvements to the Upper Church's sound system (especially new speakers for increased volume in the area near the first seven pews at the front of the church and near/in the sanctuary, and (c) security cameras and safety/surveillance outdoor and indoor equipment (deferred from last year's work list due to the decline in Sunday collection revenue). Other parish-related uses of ACA proceeds are also under consideration

The following projects that were earmarked for last year's 2020 ACA rebate funding are in-process presently or already completed: (a) replacing and upgrading the votive candle racks in the rear of the church and in the St. Ann and Virgin Mary Shrine; (b) masonry repairs of the church's 1886 cornerstone, west façade steps, courtyard pavers, and walls of the north stairwell to the Lower Church and other rainwater drainage repairs around the church's foundation; (c) replacement of liturgical vestments that were showing their age; and (d) upgrades to the Lower Church's air ventilation and filtration systems and equipment.

As the people of the Diocese of Trenton, we and you and all of us have an opportunity to help others see Christ working in our midst. I ask you to please take a moment and truly reflect on any help you can give. We truly need everyone to participate. This year we again are striving to do our parish fair share toward helping the Diocese reach the Diocesan/four-county/107-parish goal of \$7 million in the 2021 Annual Appeal.

I am always grateful and moved by the level of support you give to our parish and to our Diocese. I thank you for this support, and may God continue to bless you and your family and St. Michael's Parish.

The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Jesus elevated marriage to a Sacrament at the Wedding Feast at Cana. Catholics have the duty to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony in a church. The Grace of the Sacrament of Matrimony enhances and supports the permanent and indissoluble bond of marriage and strengthens the love and fidelity, patience and wisdom of the spouses.

Please make contact with the parish office at least one year prior to your intended marriage date to begin the

preparation process. This includes attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference and several meetings with one of our parish priests. A specific wedding date cannot be assured by the parish until *after* this marriage preparation has commenced and initial documentation has been received and reviewed. Therefore, all



engaged couples are strongly advised to *speak to the* parish staff first when beginning to make wedding plans and strongly advised not to make commitments with third-parties (banquet halls, photographers, hotels, airlines, etc.) until after the wedding date has been finalized in writing with the parish office.

If you are presently in a civil marriage and desire to receive the Sacrament and enter into a valid Catholic marriage, please contact the parish office at 732-222-8080 to obtain further information about the "convalidation" of your marriage. We also offer direction and assistance on the possibility of receiving an annulment for those who are divorced. Please do not hesitate to call. The annulment process is generally less difficult or cumbersome than imagined.

The Blessed Mother, the Center, and the St. Joseph Candles will be lit this week in prayer for the nurses, doctors, healthcare workers, family members, and friends who are caring for and treating COVID-19 patients; for their own health and safety; and for their courage, professionalism, and love.



PARISH COUNSELING SERVICES

St. Michael's and some of our surrounding parishes do this vigil Mondays at Panned Parenthood. Please consider coming and joining us.

We do not go on the property, we do not go on the driveway or park in the Planned Parenthood lot. We follow all COVID-

19 precautions including wearing a mask and social distancing.
