
BAPTISMS

<u>Pastor's Note</u>. Mass attendance was understandably very low at the Sunday morning Masses last week (February 14) due to the ice and snow storm. We are re-publishing Bishop O'Connell's letter that appeared in last Sunday's bulletin and that reminds us of the pur-



poses of Lent and of our Lenten obligations and that encourages "a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter."

February 7, 2021

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from Ash Wednesday, February 17, 2021 until Holy Thursday, April 1, 2021 --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and</u> ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. The pastor of a parish has the authority to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish. The Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included in the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, April 20-21, 2021 to Trinity Sunday, May 30, 2021. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.


LENT 2021

Our Lenten observances will include the following:

- On Fridays during Lent, *Mass* will be celebrated at *12:15 p.m. and at 5:30 p.m.* in the Upper Church. The 8:00 a.m. Mass on Fridays remains unchanged.
- These Friday 12:15 and 5:30 Masses during Lent will be followed by Confessions for 30 minutes. Confession also follows the weekday 8:00 a.m. Mass until 9:00 a.m.
- *Eucharistic Adoration* will follow the 12:15 Mass on these Fridays of Lent until 5:15 p.m.
- Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays of Lent <u>at 7:00 p.m. this year</u> (not 7:30 p.m. as in recent past years). There will be no Soup & Salad Suppers this year in light of covid precautions.

May our Lenten journeys nourish our minds and hearts, strengthen us against the chains of sin, and bring us closer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The neighboring parishes of "Cohort 17" will be collaborating with each other and again coordinating Confession schedules (see below) during the fourth week of the Lenten Season to maximize opportunities for those desiring the Sacrament of Reconciliation as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter. Cohort 17 Lenten Reconciliation Week 2021 begins on Monday, March 15 and continues to Sunday, March 21.... "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away and that the Lord may grant you times of refreshment and send you the Messiah." (Acts 3:19-20) Confessions will be available every day that week at the church locations and times noted below. The Cohort 17 parishes are Christ the King (Our Lady Star of the Sea and Holy Trinity), Our Lady of Hope (St. Jerome's and St. Mary of the Assumption), and St. Michael's. Please pause during the Season of Lent and make it a priority to make time for a good Confession.

The Bishop's ACA video was scheduled to be presented at last Sunday's Masses but will instead be presented at all Masses this Sunday (Feb. 21).

Every year at this time, I reach out to the faithful of the Diocese of Trenton to ask for your help and support of the Annual Catholic Appeal. But as we all know, this is not just "another year." I am mindful that I am coming to you during a time that has been and remains very challenging.

From the Pastor's Desk Dear Parishioners and Friends of St. Michael's Church:

The weekend of February 14 and 15 is Pledge Weekend for this year's Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA) throughout the Diocese of Trenton. Each year Bishop O'Connell seeks the support of all of the members of the Diocese of Trenton to further the work of our ministries. Each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each of us can share in all we do with a gift to

the Annual Catholic Appeal. Our single Act of Faith propels the works of love that build up our Church. You make that happen with a generous gift to the ACA. Please read the Bishop's ACA letter published above.

This year St. Michael's share of the Diocesan-wide goal is \$109,000 (the same goal as in the past eleven years and the goal that we achieved last year and the two years before that for the first times). As the result of reaching our parish ACA goal in each of those three most recent years we not only strongly supported the Diocese in its ministries and charitable works and demonstrated our commitment to stewardship and charitable giving, our parish also gained the financial reward of a \$23,000 rebate in 2018 and a \$16,500 rebate in each of 2019 and 2020. Those ACA rebate funds were utilized for the Lower Church restrooms renovation project, church foundation water-proofing and repairs, CCD/education materials, Covid-related upgrades to the Lower Church's ventilation equipment, and buildings and grounds repairs. The 2020 ACA rebate was also used in part to fund ordinary operating expenses since - as we all know - the parish's revenue from Sunday collections and the Easter and Christmas collections was significantly depleted in 2020 due to the pandemic and reduced in-church Mass attendance.

I have proposed to the parish trustees and finance council that if St. Michael's is successful again in achieving the parish's \$109,000 ACA goal and earns and receives a rebate of \$16,000 or more that the parish use those rebate funds for: (a) upgrades to the air filtration/ventilation system and equipment in the Upper Church (including a state-of-the-



art germicidal, ultra-violet light air purifier), (b) improvements to the Upper Church's sound system (especially new speakers for increased volume in the area near the first seven pews at the front of the church and near/in the sanctuary, and (c) security cameras and safety/surveillance outdoor and indoor equipment (deferred from last year's work list due to the decline in Sunday collection revenue). Other parish-related uses of ACA proceeds are also under consideration.

The following projects that were earmarked for last year's 2020 ACA rebate funding are in-process presently or already completed: (a) replacing and upgrading the votive candle racks in the rear of the church and in the St. Ann and Virgin Mary Shrine; (b) masonry repairs of the church's 1886 cornerstone, west façade steps, courtyard pavers, and walls of the north stairwell to the Lower Church and other rainwater drainage repairs around the church's foundation; (c) replacement of liturgical vestments that were showing their age; and (d) upgrades to the Lower Church's air ventilation and filtration systems and equipment.

As the people of the Diocese of Trenton, we and you and all of us have an opportunity to help others see Christ working in our midst. I ask you to please take a moment and truly reflect on any help you can give. We truly need everyone to participate. This year we again are striving to do our parish fair share toward helping the Diocese reach the Diocesan/four-county/107-parish goal of \$7 million in the 2021 Annual Appeal.

I am always grateful and moved by the level of support you give to our parish and to our Diocese. I thank you for this support, and may God continue to bless you and your family and St. Michael's Parish.

Stream the Stations of the Cross with Bishop O'Connell this Lent



Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., will lead a special, multimedia experience of the Way of the Cross, which will be available for streaming on the Diocese of Trenton's YouTube channel beginning Friday, Feb. 19. The presentation will feature the watercolor portrayal of the 14 stations by popular 19th century French painter James Tissot, one of Bishop O'Connell's favorite artists. After experiencing a spiritual vision while visiting the Church of St. Sulpice in Paris, Tissot dedicated his artistry to portraying the life of Christ in 350 watercolors based upon the Gospels – 14 of which depict the Stations of the Cross. The entire collection was purchased by and remains on display with the Brooklyn Museum of Art. Bishop O'Connell observed that the Stations' portrayal has been "selected to help us prayerfully envision the Passion and Death of the Lord Jesus Christ." Leading prayers first composed by St. Alphonsus Liguori, the Bishop invites the faithful to join him in commemorating the Way of the Cross this

St. Michael's and some of our surrounding parishes do this vigil Mondays at Panned Parenthood. Please consider coming and joining us.

We do not go on the property, we do not go on the driveway or park in the Planned Parenthood lot. We follow all COVID-19 precautions including wearing

a mask and social distancing.


