LENT 2023


Our Lenten observances will include the following:

LAUNCH WEEKEND: FEB. 24 & 25

This year St. Michael's share of the Diocesan-wide goal is \$104,000 (a dollar amount that has been reduced by the Diocese from our former goal of many years of \$109,000; this reduction is in light of our parish's recent lower numbers in terms of Sunday Mass attendance and the Sunday Offertory collection). We at St. Michael's achieved our ACA goal last year and the six years before that for the first times; we've been batting 1,000% in the Annual Appeal since 2017! As the result of reaching our parish ACA goal in each of those seven most recent years we not only strongly supported the Diocese in its charitable works and ministries (including sending young men to the seminary to become our priests of the future) and demonstrated our commitment to stewardship and charitable giving, our parish also gained the financial reward of a rebate that has averaged \$20,200 per year for each of the past seven years (2023 back to 2017).

Those ACA rebate funds have been utilized for the Lower Church restrooms renovation project, church foundation water-proofing and repairs, CCD/education materials, church roof repairs, Covid-related upgrades to the Lower Church's ventilation equipment, new ventilation equipment for the Confessionals, and buildings and grounds repairs. The 2022 ACA rebate was also used in part to fund ordinary operating expenses since - as we all know - the parish's revenue from Sunday collections and the Easter and Christmas collections was depleted in 2022 due to the pandemic and reduced in-church Mass attendance. I have proposed to our Parish Trustees and the Parish Finance Council that we use the hoped-for 2024 ACA rebate to pay for a significant portion of the boiler repairs and the ultimate boiler replacement so that we can keep the heat "on" in our church; details about our church's heat, boiler, and boiler expenses may be found on Page 6 of last Sunday's February 18 bulletin.

As the people of the Diocese of Trenton, we and you and I and *all of us* have an opportunity to help others see Christ working in our midst. I ask you to please take a moment and prayerfully reflect on any help you can give. We truly need everyone to participate. This year we again are striving to do our parish fair share toward helping the Diocese reach the Diocesan-wide/four-county/97-parish goal of \$6.5 million in the 2024 Annual Catholic Appeal. I am always grateful and moved by the level of support that you give to our parish and to our Diocese. I thank you for this support, and may God continue to bless you and your family and St. Michael's Parish.

Communion Visits; Confession Visits; Anointing of the Sick



Please keep in mind that the parish priest and our lay Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist are Eucharistic available and eager to bring Communion to parishioners who are in the hospital (nursing homes, assisted living facilities, rehab cen-

ters, and hospices, too) and to parishioners who are at home but unable to get to church. Please contact Mary Valan at the parish office or Dotty O'Hara at (908)310-6497 to make arrangements. Hospitals and other healthcare facilities generally do not notify the parish office regarding their Catholic patients who desire to receive Sacraments. And so it falls to the patient herself/ himself or to a family member or friend to contact the parish office to make the request. The parish priest will also very gladly make a hospital visit or home visit to hear a Confession and/or administer the Sacrament of the Sick ("Anointing of the Sick") in addition to bringing Holy Communion. Please remember to contact the parish office or Dotty to make these arrangements. Thank you.





BAPTISM GODPARENTS AND CONFIRMATION SPONSORS

Have you been asked to be a Baptism GODPARENT? Have you been asked to SPONSOR someone who is preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, or for an adult in the RCIA program?



It is an honor and a privilege to be asked. You are seen as someone whom a family, child, teenager, or adult looks up to as living the Christian Catholic faith in a complete, strong, and exemplary manner. You model that behavior and faith in the way that you live your life.

To receive a letter signed and sealed by the Pastor to verify your eligibility to serve as a Baptism Godparent or as a Confirmation Sponsor (such letters are required by (and issued by) virtually all Catholic parishes in the United States including St. Michael's), please keep the following eligibility criteria in mind:

- Registered at (for at least three months) and active parishioner of St. Michael's Church.
- At least 16 years of age.
- Completed all Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation).
- If married, married in the Catholic Church according to Catholic Church Law, or with the express permission of the Church. If unmarried, living a chaste single life (including not cohabitating).
- Attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and receive the sacraments of the Church regularly.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor is to be based on the person's dedication to the faith and consistent practice thereof.

Sponsor letters will be gladly and happily given to individuals who meet all of these criteria and who have been *registered members of our parish for at least three months*. If there are any questions or concerns regarding the Church's teaching on these matters or on the criteria for and interpretation of the qualifications for Baptism godparenthood or Confirmation sponsorship, please feel free to call the parish office to arrange for a telephone conversation or meeting with Fr. Butler.



OUR PROMISE TO PROTECT:
