
BAPTISMS

During Lent Please Give Yourself – AND Jesus! – the Gift of Eucharistic Adoration and a Holy Hour



What is "Eucharistic Adoration"? What is a "Holy Hour"? Understood simply, Eucharistic Adoration is quiet, silent prayer, contemplation, meditation, spiritual/scriptural reading, and the like while reverently seated or kneeling before the Blessed Sacrament in the sacred, holy serenity of the church. Quiet, prayerful, restorative time with God. Some have referred to Eucharistic Adoration (tongue-in-cheek) as "wasting time with God" – and what a wonderful, powerful, grace-filled, revitalizing, beneficial waste of time it is! Peaceful, private time (a full hour or even ten or fifteen minutes) spent adoring, honoring, thanking God –

"giving God His due, giving God our ear" and our undivided, undistracted attention – by gazing upon the Eucharistic Presence of Christ as the Blessed Sacrament resides in the Mon-

strance placed upon the altar.


In a deeper sense, Eucharistic Adoration involves "the contemplation of the Mystery of Christ truly present before us." During Eucharistic Adoration, we "watch and wait"... we remain silent in the Real/True Presence of Jesus...we open ourselves to His Graces which flow from the Eucharist. By worshiping the Eucharistic Jesus, we become what God wants us to be! Like a magnet, the Lord draws us to Himself and gently transforms us. In its fullest essence Eucharistic Adoration is "God and Man (God <u>and YOU!</u>) reaching out for each other, at the same time, and being <u>TOGETHER</u> with each other!"...Time and Time-less Eternity joined for a few miraculous moments of spiritual union.

Why Go To Eucharistic Adoration? Why Pray a Holy Hour? St. Alphonse Liguori wrote: "Of all devotions, that of adoring Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament is the greatest after the Sacraments themselves, the one

dearest to God and the one most helpful to us. The Eucharist is a priceless treasure: By not only celebrating the Eucharist *during* Mass, but also by praying before It *outside* of Mass, we are enabled to make contact with the very well-springs of Grace."

When asked "What would save the world?" Saint/Mother Teresa replied: "My answer is prayer. What we need is for every parish to come before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in holy hours of prayer."

The Invitation. The homilies at all of the Masses at St. Michael's this weekend will focus on Eucharistic Adoration, explain and emphasize its importance and value/benefits, and invite and encourage us to pray a Holy Hour before the Blessed Sacrament. Days and times for Eucharistic Adoration here at St. Michael's – quiet prayer in front of the Blessed Sacrament reposing in the Monstrance on the altar – are listed above. During the current season of Lent extra hours for Adoration have been added to the parish's weekly calendar to accommodate as best we can parishioners' and visitors' busy schedules. Please accept the invitation. Please make the effort – especially during Lent as we prepare for Easter and Holy Week – to break away briefly from your routine and to take advantage of the opportunity: • to give to Jesus the gift of grateful, reverent prayer and wor-



ship, • to give to yourself the gift of God's peace, strength, encouragement, and love that flow from that wellspring of the Eucharist, • to give back a few minutes to the Savior who has given you a re-opened gateway to Heaven by the gift of His hours and death on the Cross for Mankind. During Lent please give yourself – AND give Jesus! – the Gift of Eucharistic Adoration and the Gift of a Holy Hour.


DURING THE SEASON OF LENT 2021....

Our Lenten observances will include the following:

- On Fridays during Lent, *Mass* will be celebrated at *12:15 p.m. and at 5:30 p.m.* in the Upper Church. The 8:00 a.m. Mass on Fridays remains unchanged.
- These Friday 12:15 and 5:30 Masses during Lent will be followed by Confessions for 30 minutes. Confession also follows the weekday 8:00 a.m. Mass until 9:00 a.m.
- Eucharistic Adoration will follow the 12:15 Mass on these Fridays of Lent until 5:15 p.m. In addition, extra hours for Adoration during Lent have been placed on the calendar: Thursday, March 4 from 8:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. following the 6:00 p.m. Confirmation that evening Fridays (commencing March 5) from 6:00 p.m. to 6:50 p.m. between the 5:30 p.m. Mass and 7:00 p.m. Stations of the Cross Sundays (commencing March 7) from 6:00 p.m. to 6:50 p.m. prior to the Sunday 7:00 p.m. Mass.
- Stations of the Cross will be prayed on Fridays of Lent <u>at 7:00 p.m. this year</u> (not 7:30 p.m. as in recent past years). There will be no Soup & Salad Suppers this year in light of covid precautions.

May our Lenten journeys nourish our minds and hearts, strengthen us against the chains of sin, and bring us closer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.

The neighboring parishes of "Cohort 17" will be collaborating with each other and again coordinating Confession schedules (see below) during the fourth week of the Lenten Season to maximize opportunities for those desiring the Sacrament of Reconciliation as we prepare for Holy Week and Easter. <u>Cohort 17 Lenten Reconciliation Week 2021</u> begins on Monday, March 15 and continues to Sunday, March 21.... "Repent, therefore, and be converted, that your sins may be wiped away and that the Lord may grant you times of refreshment and send you the Messiah." (Acts 3:19-20) Confessions will be available every day that week at the church locations and times noted below. We desire to continue celebrating these Masses until winter cold weather makes it unfeasible for the health of the Communion Ministers, ushers, and other volunteers. 



Stream the Stations of the Cross with Bishop O'Connell this Lent



Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., is leading a special, multimedia experience of the Way of the Cross, is available for streaming on the Diocese of Trenton's YouTube channel. The presentation features the watercolor portrayal of the 14 stations by popular 19th century French painter James Tissot, one of Bishop O'Connell's favorite artists. After experiencing a spiritual vision while visiting the Church of St. Sulpice in Paris, Tissot dedicated his artistry to portraying the life of Christ in 350 watercolors based upon the Gospels – 14 of which depict the Stations of the Cross. The entire collection was purchased by and remains on display with the Brooklyn Museum of Art. Bishop O'Connell has observed that the Stations' portrayal has been "selected to help us prayerfully envision the Passion and Death of the Lord Jesus Christ." Leading prayers first composed by St. Alphonsus Liguori, the Bishop invites the faithful to join him in commemorating the Way of the Cross

From the Desk of Our Director of Religious Education



As members of the Catholic Church, every sacrament received not only confers grace on the individual, but it also builds up the *entire* Body of Christ. In other words, whether baptism, marriage or confession, every time one of the seven sacraments is experienced, it has effects in you and me. We must always keep in mind that In Christ we are One.

The thirty-seven youths in our parish who have been preparing to be confirmed on March 4th this year by Monsignor Thomas Gervasio, are moving into deeper communion with the Church, which means deeper communion with you and me. When they are sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, they join us in the solemn obligation to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross. Quite a challenge, especially in a country growing ever more hostile to the truth

of the Gospel. Our new Confirmandi will need Wisdom, Understanding, Right Judgment, Courage, Knowledge, Reverence and Wonder and Awe of God, (the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit) to overcome the challenges and the deceits of this world.

We would do well to reflect on how we (all of us!) are fulfilling our own Confirmation witness. With tragic consequences many Catholics do not put the full grace of Confirmation into practice. Like all sacraments, it unites us more firmly to Christ if we continue to pursue the relationship. There is no

"graduation" from knowing Jesus in the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy, reading Scripture, attending Mass, confessing our sins, and living out our Catholic faith. The measure of joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity, and love in our lives (the fruits of the Holy Spirit) is a good indication of how we're responding to the Holy Spirit's indwelling in us.

As Catholics we need to do a better job of confessing Christ more boldly and supporting each other in the Faith. To begin with, let us pray for each other, but don't stop there. 
