BAPTISMS





<u>Pastor's Note</u>. Each Sunday at Noon (Rome time) the Holy Father usually appears in the window of the Papal apartment to give a weekly Angelus address. The Pope's Angelus address is typically a short homily about the Sunday Mass readings. After delivering this reflection on the readings, the Pope proceeds to pray the Angelus Domini (or the Regina Coeli during Easter). Afterwards he typically greets the pilgrims who that are present in the square in various languages of the world. The following is Pope Francis' Angelus address of two weeks ago on the <u>First Sunday of Lent</u> (Feb. 26, 2023). It is very instructive and helpful on <u>how to practice Lent well</u> and with <u>reliance on the Word of God</u> and <u>frequent reading of the Scriptures during the Season of Lent and also in any and all times of trial and temptation</u>. POPE FRANCIS ANGELUS

Saint Peter's Square Sunday, 26 February 2023



Dear brothers and sisters, buongiorno!

- [1] The Gospel of this first Sunday of Lent [February 26th] presents to us Jesus in the desert, tempted by the devil (cf. *Mt* 4:1-11). "*Devil*" means "*divider*". *The devil always wants to create division*, and it is what he sets out to do by tempting Jesus. Let us see, then, *from whom* he wants to divide him, and *how* he tempts him.
- [2] <u>From whom does the devil want to divide Jesus?</u> After receiving Baptism from John in the Jordan, Jesus was called by the Father "my beloved Son" (Mt 3:17), and the Holy Spirit descended upon him in the form of a dove (cf. v. 16). The Gospel thus presents us the three divine Persons joined in love. Then Jesus himself will say that he came into the world to make us, too, partake in the unity between him and the Father (cf. Jn 17:11). The devil, instead, does the opposite: he enters the scene <u>to divide Jesus from the Father and to distract him from his mission of unity for us. He always divides.</u>
- [3] Let us now see how he tries to do it. The devil wants to take advantage of the human condition of Jesus, who is weak as he has fasted for forty days and is hungry (cf. Mt 4:2). The evil one then tries to instil in him three powerful "poisons", to paralyse his mission of unity. These poisons are attachment, mistrust, and power. First and foremost, the poison of attachment to material goods, to needs; with persuasive arguments the devil tries to convince Jesus: "You are hungry, why must you fast? Listen to your need and satisfy it, you have the right and the power: transform the stones into bread". Then the second poison, mistrust: "Are you sure the Father wants what is good for you? Test him, blackmail him! Throw yourself down from the highest point of the temple and make him do what you want". Finally, the third poison, power: "You have no need for your Father! Why wait for his gifts? Follow the criteria of the world, take everything for yourself, and you will be powerful!". The three temptations of Jesus. And we too live among these same temptations, always. It is terrible, but that is just how it is, for us too: attachment to material things, mistrust and the thirst for power are three widespread and dangerous temptations, which the devil uses to divide us from the Father and to make us no longer feel like brothers and sisters among ourselves, to lead us to solitude and desperation. He wanted to do this to Jesus, he wants to do it to us: to lead us to desperation.
- [4] But Jesus defeats the temptations. And how does he defeat them? By avoiding discussion with the devil and answering with the Word of God. This is important: you cannot argue with the devil, you cannot converse with the devil! Jesus confronts him with the Word of God. He quotes three phrases from the Scripture that speak of freedom from goods (cf. Dt 8:3), trust (cf. Dt 6:16), and service to God (cf. Dt 6:13), three phrases that are opposed to temptation. He never enters into dialogue with the devil, he does not negotiate with him, but he repels his insinuations with the beneficent Words of the Scripture. It is an invitation to us too; one cannot defeat him by negotiating with him, he is stronger than [we are]. We defeat the devil by countering him in faith with the divine Word. In this way, Jesus teaches us to defend unity with God and among ourselves from the attacks of the divider. The divine Word that is Jesus' answer to the temptation of the devil.
- [5] And we ask ourselves: what place does the Word of God have in my life? Do I turn to it in my spiritual struggles? If I have a vice or a recurrent temptation, why do I not obtain help by seeking out a verse of the Word of God that responds to that vice? Then, when temptation comes, I recite it, I pray it, trusting in the grace of Christ. Let us try, it will help us in temptation, it will help us a great deal, so that, amid the voices that stir within us, the beneficent one of the Word of God will resound.
- [6] May Mary, who welcomed the Word of God and with her humility defeated the pride of the divider, accompany us in the spiritual struggle of Lent....
 - [7]....And I wish you all a happy Sunday. Please, do not forget to pray for me. Enjoy your lunch, and arrivederci!










Parish Goal = \$109,000





St. Patrick's Day 2023: **Bishop's Permission for** Eating Meat on FRIDAY, March 17

Pastor's Note. In an email dated February 8, 2023 and published below, our Bishop, His Excellency David M. O'Connell, C.M., has granted for this coming St. Patrick's Day (which falls on a Friday this year) a dispensation from the Lenten Friday obligation to abstain from eating meat. If you take advantage of this permission to eat meat on St. Patrick's Day this year, please also take note of and observe the Bishop's request to transfer your Friday abstinence obligation to another day of your choosing in Lent or to perform a work of charity or some exercise of piety to fulfill the spirit of the Lenten obligation.

"The Holy Season of Lent brings with it the serious annual penitential obligation to abstain from meat on Fridays of Lent. This year, 2023, however, Friday of the third week of Lent corresponds with Saint Patrick's Day (March 17), which has traditionally been an occasion for special celebrations. As Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, I am granting a dispensation from the obligation to abstain from eating meat to Catholics of the Diocese of Trenton as well as to any visitors or travelers who may be physically present within the territory of this Diocese on Friday, March 17.

Those Catholics taking advantage of the dispensation, however, are asked to transfer the Friday abstinence obligation to another day of their choosing in Lent or to perform a work of charity (for example, a donation to the poor) or some exercise of piety (for example, a visit to church and prayer before the Blessed Sacrament, a Rosary, or some other prayer, etc.) to fulfill the spirit of the obligation."

The Stations of the Cross in OUR Church: Walking the Road to Calvary TOGETHER with Jesus and Mary During OUR 44 Days of Lent





EARTHQUAKES ROCK TURKEY AND SYRIA Please help families today with critical relief

On February 6th, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake devastated large areas of central Turkey and northwest Syria. The death toll has surpassed 7,000 and continues to climb. The earthquake is the worst to strike Turkey this century. Later that day, the region experienced a second magnitude 7.7 quake.

Across affected areas in both countries, apartment buildings and schools have been leveled. For Syrians, the damage took place in areas already devastated by years of war. In Turkey, the airports and the high roads of Anatolia are closed and most hospitals are unusable. Schools have been closed across the country.

Catholic Relief Services will support emergency relief efforts led by local partners in both Syria and Turkey with Caritas Turkey, Caritas Syria in Aleppo and Latta-kia—where extensive damage has been reported—and other local partners. Already in Turkey, Caritas Anatolia, in coordination with authorities, is bringing displaced people to safe, open spaces and distributing hot meals and clothing. The dioceses of Izmir and Istanbul are collecting donations to send to the Anatolia Region.

Your gifts will help partners to provide safe shelter and access to food, clean water, and hygiene supplies.




The Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Jesus elevated marriage to a Sacrament at the Wedding Feast at Cana. Catholics have the duty to receive the Sacrament of Matrimony in a Catholic church. The Grace of the Sacrament of Matrimony enhances and supports the permanent and indissoluble bond of marriage and strengthens the love and fidelity, patience and wisdom of the spouses.

Please make contact with the parish office at least

one year prior to your intended marriage date to begin the preparation process. This includes attendance at a Pre-Cana Conference and several meetings with one of our parish priests. A specific wedding date cannot be assured by the parish until *after* this marriage preparation has commenced and initial docu-



mentation has been received and reviewed. Therefore, all engaged couples are strongly advised to *speak to the parish staff first* when beginning to make wedding plans and *strongly advised not to make commitments with third-parties* (banquet halls, photographers, hotels, airlines, etc.) until *after* the wedding date has been finalized in writing with the parish office.

If you are presently in a civil marriage and desire to receive the Sacrament and enter into a valid Catholic marriage, please contact the parish office at 732-222-8080 to obtain further information about the "convalidation" of your marriage. We also offer direction and assistance on the possibility of receiving an annulment for those who are divorced. Please do not hesitate to call. The annulment process is generally less difficult or cumbersome than imagined.

BAPTISM GODPARENTS AND CONFIRMATION SPONSORS

Have you been asked to be a Baptism GODPARENT? Have you been asked to SPONSOR someone who is preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, or for an adult in the RCIA program?

It is an honor and a privilege to be asked. You are seen as someone whom a family, child, teenager, or adult looks



up to as living the Christian Catholic faith in a complete, strong, and exemplary manner. You model that behavior and faith in the way that you live your life.

To receive a letter signed and sealed by the Pastor to verify your eligibility to serve as a Baptism Godparent or as a Confirmation Sponsor (such letters are required by (and issued by) virtual-

ly all Catholic parishes in the United States including St. Michael's), please keep the following eligibility criteria in mind:

- Registered at (for at least three months) and active parishioner of St. Michael's Church.
- At least 16 years of age.
- Completed all Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Holy Communion, and Confirmation).
- If married, married in the Catholic Church according to Catholic Church Law, or with the express permission of the Church. If unmarried, living a chaste single life (including not cohabitating).
- Attend Mass on all Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation and receive the sacraments of the Church regularly.

The Church takes very seriously the role of being a sponsor. Choosing a sponsor is to be based on the person's dedication to the faith and consistent practice thereof.

Sponsor letters will be gladly and happily given to individuals who meet all of these criteria and who have been *registered members of our parish for at least three months*. If there are any questions or concerns regarding the Church's teaching on these matters or on the criteria for and interpretation of the qualifications for Baptism godparenthood or Confirmation sponsorship, please feel free to call the parish office to arrange for a telephone conversation or meeting with Fr. Butler.
