BAPTISMS





Eternal rest grant unto Fr. Foley, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May



The three "thermometers" above compare our parish's 2019 vs. 2020 vs. 2021 results-to-date in the Annual Appeal. The thermometers indicate good news. This year's total after sixteen weekends is significantly ahead of our parish's total after sixteen weekends both in 2020 and 2019. We are now more than three quarters of the way to our goal! Thank you! As Saint/Mother Teresa said: "Together we can do great things!"

*This \$87,768 figure is approximately 80.5% of our parish goal. It was received as of the sixteenth weekend of the campaign (tallied as of June 9) from 344 pledgers or check-writing contributors (and many unidentified, unquantified cash contributors) all of whom comprise approximately 11.8% of the 2,899 registered households of the parish. Thank you! The Diocese sent a Diocesanwide mailing during the week of Feb. 10 to all registered parishioners and past ACA contributors asking for prayerful consideration of a pledge/contribution to the Appeal. 

Each year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) encourages the observance of Religious Freedom Week. Beginning with the feast day of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, and including the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, the week-long commemoration ends with the feast of Sts. Peter and Paul.


Religious Freedom Week will be observed this year from June 22 to June 29 and the theme chosen is *Solidarity in Freedom*. "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community" (*Fratelli tutti*, 116). Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all.

The USCCB has prepared resources to "Pray – Reflect – Act" which may be found at: www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek. Each day focuses on different religious liberty topics of concern for the bishops. These materials were prepared to help people understand religious liberty from a Catholic perspective, pray about particular issues, and act on what they learn by advocating for policies that promote religious freedom.

The USCCB's Committee for Religious Liberty collaborated with the Office of International Justice and Peace to raise awareness and show solidarity with people throughout the world who suffer for their faith, from the persecution of Christians in Nicaragua to highlighting Pope Francis's trip to Iraq this year. Domestically, a major area of concern continues to be freedom for Catholic institutions, such as schools, hospitals, and child welfare service providers, to carry out their missions with integrity.

Through prayer, education, and public action during Religious Freedom Week, the USCCB hopes to promote the essential right of religious freedom for Catholics and for those of *all* faiths.

<u>Pastor's Note</u>. Three Sundays ago (May 23) we celebrated Pentecost Sunday – the arrival of the Holy Spirit fifty days after the Resurrection of Jesus: "the Spirit who renews the face of the earth." On our Pentecost Sunday of 2021 at our 7:00 a.m. Mass here at St. Michael's, Msgr. John J. Carroll was our celebrant and homilist. Monsignor preached a homily (re-printed below) that took as its launching point a story about an Irish poet who meets a detective from Scotland Yard at his birthday party. Through this amusing anecdote Msgr. Carroll helps us to see how we leave "fingerprints of the Spirit" with our every word, deed, and prayer.

Homily for Pentecost 2021: Fingerprints of the Spirit

What do an Irish poet, a Scotland Yard detective, and our celebration of Pentecost have in common?

When the famous Irish playwright George Bernard Shaw turned 90 a birthday party was held. Among his guests was Robert Fabian, Scotland Yard's celebrated detective. At Fabian's suggestion Shaw agreed to have his finger-prints recorded for posterity.



To the amazement of both, Shaw's fingerprints were so faint that no impression could be attained. "Well," announced Shaw with a smile, "had I known this sooner I should certainly have chosen another profession....perhaps a life of crime and other misadventures!"

In light of Shaw's prolific writing career, we are grateful that the knowledge of his fingerprints came to light at such a late date.

As we celebrate this feast of Pentecost, we affirm that the Holy Spirit has left fingerprints of love, power and multiple gifts in our hearts and in our lives. We also celebrate our mission to leave our fingerprints everywhere – fingerprints of love, power, and goodness as we share our multiple gifts.

Our words and our deeds might be called Fingerprints of the Spirit.

Fingerprints of the Spirit are the way we influence and leave a little bit of ourselves with others through our words and actions. We leave Fingerprints of the Spirit with whomever we touch. While hand sanitizer and social distancing may have kept us from touching physically, we were not kept from leaving our mark – our fingerprints – on each other psychologically, emotionally, and spiritually.

Our words and our deeds are as unique as our fingerprints. While ordinary fingerprints can be wiped away, Fingerprints of the Spirit are forever because they have an eternal significance to God.

The Holy Spirit empowers, enables, and motivates us to share generously what we have and who we are with each other. These are our Fingerprints of the Spirit.

Rather than speaking about the fingerprints we leave, it is appropriate on this Feast of Pentecost to pray and reflect on the ways that the Holy Spirit has influenced us and prompted us to leave our mark on others. We will now make the time to pray under the guidance of the Holy Spirit in this brief meditation. Please close your eyes, take a deep breath, and breathe out anxiety and any negative emotion. Breathe in the light, love and wisdom of the Holy Spirit. Breathe deeply. Exhale.

Picture your hands (your eyes are still closed tightly!), lay them before you in an open position, imagine your own fingerprints. Ask the Holy Spirit to guide your memory and thoughts (continue breathing deeply). Remember this past year and especially the long months of the covid pandemic. What are the fingerprints you left? What words did you speak that were encouraging, strengthening, and supportive of another person? Whom have you touched through your prayer? Pray for them again now. Which of your deeds left an indelible and helpful mark (a permanent fingerprint...a positive and a helpful fingerprint) on the life of another?

Ask the Holy Spirit to inspire you. Who may need your words of encouragement or good deeds this day or this week? What action will you take? In what area of your life would you like the Holy Spirit to touch? What most needs the healing touch of God? Now, let's open our eyes and conclude the homily.

Unlike George Bernard Shaw, God desires for us – through the working of the Holy Spirit – to leave our mark on others and on our world. This Pentecost may we leave everywhere.... Fingerprints of the Holy Spirit!

World Day of Prayer for Grandparents and the Elderly Sunday, July 25, 2021

The "Day" is intended to foster a greater recognition of grandparents for their role and vocation in passing on their Catholic faith to the next generations. Plans are being developed

FAQs and Summary of Key Changes in Our Revised Covid Protocols

In last Sunday's June 6 bulletin (on pages 4 and 5) there appeared the complete list of *Revisions of Current Covid Protocols* as published by the Diocese of Trenton on May 26. Below is a list of a few of those revisions accompanied by further details on timing and implementation here at St. Michael's. In the event of any questions, please contact the parish office.

- <u>Parking Lot Mass</u>. The parking lot Masses will continue through and including Sunday, July 4. Saturdays at 4:00 and Sundays at 10:00. The last parking lot Mass will be on Sunday, July 4.
- <u>Face Masks</u>. Face masks are no longer required. They may be worn by those who choose to do so. Face masks are encouraged for those who have not received the covid vaccine.
- <u>Social Distancing and Seating Capacity</u>. Social distancing is no longer required. The red ropes have been removed from the church. All pews and all seats will be available for use subject to the fire marshal restrictions on seating capacity and to safety considerations and common sense (especially on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day).
- <u>Holy Communion</u>. We have returned to our pre-pandemic method of distributing and receiving Communion: Communicants process to the altar area via the center aisle in two lines. Communion ministers will wear their face masks while distributing the Eucharist. *Receiving Communion on the hand is strongly favored and strongly encouraged*. Receiving Communion on the tongue is permitted but we ask all to please charitably and respectfully consider and practice receiving on the hand. Please return to your pew after receiving Communion and remain in your pew until the priest-celebrant has concluded the Mass and has processed to either the sacristy or to the church vestibule.
- <u>Holy Water</u>. Holy water fonts in the church and the dispenser in the church vestibule have been replenished as of June 4. The fonts and dispenser will be emptied, cleaned, and refilled daily.


