BAPTISMS



An afternoon of discussion and camaraderie with the Diocese's shepherd and priests will take place June 29 for those considering/discerning a call to the priesthood.





Baccalaureate Mass 2021 Saturday, June 19 at 5:30 P.M.




















Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. Registering as parishioners










Parish Goal = \$109,000

The three "thermometers" above compare our parish's 2019 vs. 2020 vs. 2021 results-to-date in the Annual Appeal. The thermometers indicate good news. This year's total after seventeen weekends is significantly ahead of our parish's total after seventeen weekends both in 2020 and 2019. We are now more than three quarters of the way to our goal! Thank you! As Saint/Mother Teresa said: "Together we can do great things!"

*This \$89,901 figure is approximately 82.5% of our parish goal. It was received as of the seventeenth weekend of the campaign (tallied as of June 16) from 348 pledgers or check-writing contributors (and many unidentified, unquantified cash contributors) all of whom comprise approximately 12% of the 2,899 registered households of the parish. Thank vou! The Diocese sent a Diocesan-wide mailing during the week of Feb. 10 to all registered parishioners and past ACA contributors asking for prayerful consideration of a pledge/contribution to the Appeal. Each year, the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) encourages the observance of Religious Freedom Week. Beginning with the feast day of Sts. Thomas More and John Fisher, and including the Nativity of St. John the Baptist, the week-long commemoration ends with the feast of Sts. Peter and Paul.

Religious Freedom Week will be observed this year from June 22 to June 29 and the theme chosen is *Solidarity in Freedom*. "Solidarity means much more than engaging in sporadic acts of generosity. It means thinking and acting in terms of community" (*Fratelli tutti*, 116). Religious freedom allows the Church, and all religious communities, to live out their faith in public and to serve the good of all.

The USCCB has prepared resources to "Pray – Reflect – Act" which may be found at: www.usccb.org/ReligiousFreedomWeek. Each day focuses on different religious liberty topics of concern for the bishops. These materials were prepared to help people understand religious liberty from a Catholic perspective, pray about particular issues, and act on what they learn by advocating for policies that promote religious freedom.

The USCCB's Committee for Religious Liberty collaborated with the Office of International Justice and Peace to raise awareness and show solidarity with people throughout the world who suffer for their faith, from the persecution of Christians in Nicaragua to highlighting Pope Francis's trip to Iraq this year. Domestically, a major area of concern continues to be freedom for Catholic institutions, such as schools, hospitals, and child welfare service providers, to carry out their missions with integrity.

Through prayer, education, and public action during Religious Freedom Week, the USCCB hopes to promote the essential right of religious freedom for Catholics and for those of *all* faiths.

FAQs and Summary of Key Changes in Our Revised Covid Protocols

In Sunday's June 6 bulletin (on pages 4 and 5) there appeared the complete list of *Revisions of Current Covid Protocols* as published by the Diocese of Trenton on May 26. Below is a list of a few of those revisions accompanied by further details on timing and implementation here at St. Michael's. In the event of any questions, please contact the parish office.

- <u>Parking Lot Mass</u>. The parking lot Masses will continue through and including Sunday, July 4. Saturdays at 4:00 and Sundays at 10:00. The last parking lot Mass will be on Sunday, July 4.
- <u>Face Masks</u>. Face masks are no longer required. They may be worn by those who choose to do so. Face masks are encouraged for those who have not received the covid vaccine.
- <u>Social Distancing and Seating Capacity</u>. Social distancing is no longer required. The red ropes have been removed from the church. All pews and all seats will be available for use subject to the fire marshal restrictions on seating capacity and to safety considerations and common sense (especially on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day).
- <u>Holy Communion</u>. We have returned to our pre-pandemic method of distributing and receiving Communion: Communicants process to the altar area via the center aisle in two lines. Communion ministers will wear their face masks while distributing the Eucharist. *Receiving Communion on the hand is strongly favored and strongly encouraged*. Receiving Communion on the tongue is permitted but we ask all to please charitably and respectfully consider and practice receiving on the hand. Please return to your pew after receiving Communion and remain in your pew until the priest-celebrant has concluded the Mass and has processed to either the sacristy or to the church vestibule.
- <u>Holy Water</u>. Holy water fonts in the church and the dispenser in the church vestibule have been replenished as of June 4. The fonts and dispenser will be emptied, cleaned, and refilled daily.

Holy Spirit Church Closes; Last Mass Celebrated on June 6



the altar linens were folded and taken away, the Blessed Sacrament was removed and the tabernacle was left empty with its door open, and the altar gates were closed. Although it was a sad occasion, the Mass was beautifully celebrated by Fr. Miguel Virella and virtually every seat in the church was taken. The church building and convent building will be sold. Some of the church's articles of religious art, votive candle racks, and the like are being generously donated by Holy Spirit to St. Michael's. The closing of this beautiful and historic Gothic-style church on Second Avenue is due to several factors including financial strain, the costs of maintaining the building and property, and decreasing Mass attendance and decreasing offertory collection donations. 
