MARRIAGES



Summer Missionary Appeal July 9 and 10, 2022



The three "thermometers" above compare our parish's 2020 vs. 2021 vs. 2022 results-to-date in the Annual Catholic Appeal. The thermometers indicate good news. This year's total after eighteen weekends is substantially ahead of our parish's total after eighteen weekends in 2021 and 2020. *This \$97,532 figure is approximately 89.5% of our parish goal. 

Holy Hour for Life on July 1st

The Supreme Court's decision in the *Roe vs. Wade* case was issued on the **22nd of the month** in January 1973.

The Supreme Court heard the oral argument in the *Dobbs vs. Jackson* case (the case that thankfully! has now been overruled) on the **1st of the month** in December 2021.

The Supreme Court's decision in the *Dobbs* case was issued last week on Friday, June 24, the date on which the Solemnity of John the Baptist is ordinarily celebrated and the date this year on which we celebrated the Solemnity of the Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary. **Now is the time to increase and intensify and continue our prayers and our fasting for the intention of the protection of human life** and for a peaceful response to the *Dobbs* result.



As we prayerfully express our gratitude for the *Dobbs* decision, we will conduct a **Holy Hour for Life** on Friday, July 1st. This will be the last of these twice-per-month Holy Hours for Life (that we commenced in January) pending the further development of ongoing plans and efforts to support the pro-life cause. This Holy Hour will take place twice on July 1st immediately after the conclusion of the 8:00 a.m. Daily Mass until 9:30 a.m. and again in the evening from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. (following the First Friday 5:30 Mass). This Holy Hour for Life will include Eucharistic Adoration, Scripture reading, reflection/homily, Rosary, and Benediction. All are invited and welcome. **The next day of these Holy Hours for Life will be Friday, July 1st at 8:30 a.m. and 6:00 p.m.** Please pray for an end to abortion; for reconciliation, conversion, and healing; and for compassionate and competent care for women during and after crisis pregnancy. And please pray for the ongoing work of the Sisters of Life. St. Michael, pray for us.

WHAT IS IT ?

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL EUCARISTIC REVIVAL?

The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative sponsored by the Bishops of the United States to inspire and prepare the People of God to be formed, healed, concerted, united, and sent out to a hurting and hungry world through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Catholic faith. The revival has officially begun in June 2022, and its milestone event will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana, from July 17-21, 2024. The National Eucharistic Revival and National Eucharistic Congress are a direct response to the Holy Father's call for a "pastoral and missionary conversion which cannot leave things as they presently are" so that the Church in the United States might be "permanently in a state of mission." (*Evangelii Gaudium*, n. 25)

This Eucharistic movement seeks to bring together clergy, religious, laity, apostolates, movements, and parish and diocesan leaders to spur momentum, collaboration, and lasting impact for the re-

newal of the Catholic Church in the U.S. over the next three years. Each year will have a strategic focus for formation and missionary discipleship.

THE FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI

June 19, 2022

We launch our national response to the Lord's call with widespread eucharistic processions and adoration on the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

YEAR OF DIOCESAN REVIVAL

2022 – 2023

This first year of the Revival invites diocesan staff, bishops, and priests to respond to the Lord's personal invitation and equips them to share this love with the faithful through Eucharistic congresses and events.

YEAR OF PARISH REVIVAL

2023 – 2024

The second phase will foster Eucharistic devotion at the parish level, strengthening our liturgical life through faithful celebration of the Mass, Eucharistic Adoration, missions, resources, preaching, and organic movements of the Holy Spirit.


