

THE STORY OF VOTIVE CANDLES

As early as 200 to 300 AD, lit candles or oil lamps were burned at the tombs of saints and sacred images and relics. Saint Jerome (d. 420) attested to this practice in his treatise Contra Vigilantium. The burning of candles as an act of prayer finds its roots in the Old Testament "burnt offerings" - the light symbolizes the prayer or devotion of the person lighting the candle, the rising smoke/vapor symbolizes the rising of the prayer to heaven, and the burning and consequent consumption of the candle symbolizes the offering of something of value to God - our time, our praise, our resources, and so forth. The lingering flame symbolizes the continuity of our prayers even when we must turn away from the candle and leave the church building.

The term "votive" comes from the Latin word votum, which means a vow, pledge or religious engagement or promise. In lighting a votive candle, we visibly express support for the person(s) for whom we are praying, and we offer to God, perhaps through the intercession of a saint, a particular intention or prayer request. The grouping of the candles together symbolizes the union of the prayers that are offered by a church community. The blue and red colors of the glassware containing our votive candles are intended to remind us of the colors traditionally associated with, respectively, our Blessed Mother and St. Joseph.

Thank you for lighting a candle and saying a prayer today at St. Michael's Church. May God bless you.

WHAT IS IT?

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL?

The National Eucharistic Revival is a three-year initiative sponsored by the Bishops of the United States to inspire and prepare the People of God to be formed, healed, concerted, united, and sent out to a hurting and hungry world through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist – the source and summit of our Catholic faith. The revival has officially begun in June 2022, and its milestone event will be a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis, Indiana, from July 17-21, 2024. The National Eucharistic Revival and National Eucharistic Congress are a direct response to the Holy Father's call for a "pastoral and missionary conversion which cannot leave things as they presently are" so that the Church United States miaht the be "permanently in state of misа sion." (Evangelii Gaudium, n. 25)

This Eucharistic movement seeks to bring together clergy, religious, laity, apostolates, movements, and parish and diocesan leaders to spur momentum, collaboration, and lasting impact for the re-

newal of the Catholic Church in the U.S. over the next three years. Each year will have a strategic focus for formation and missionary discipleship.

Why is it so important to register with a parish? Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong. Registering as pa-

rishioners requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself in a parish by contacting the parish business office. Registration is a commitment to a community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of your parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a sponsor or godparent eligibility and qualification letter from the pastor, and getting donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission. Registering in your parish is a statement of faith and confidence in the life and work of your parish. PARISH COUNSELING SERVICES

A joint effort of the Diocese of Trenton and Catholic Charities provides licensed professionals for short term counseling (up to six sessions) to parishioners dealing with difficult issues, for example, job-stress, family concerns, and bereavement.
