

<u>Pastor's Note</u>. The Pandemic of 2020-2021 – sadly – is not over. During the past week the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) issued new recommendations regarding face-masking. On Thursday of the past week Governor Mirphy, New Jersey Commissioner of Health Persichilli, and Bishop O'Connell issued guidance tracking the CDC recommendations. The Governor's announcement is published below in its entirety. It "strongly recommends that both vaccinated and unvaccinated residents wear masks in indoor settings." Bishop O'Connell has asked that our parishes in the Diocese of Trenton take notice of the new guidance and also that the guidance is "A recommendation NOT a mandate at this time." Here at St. Michael's it is recommended and not required that everyone please wear a face mask at all Masses and other occasions in the church and in the parish office and at the Catholic Center. Also, as published in the parish bulletin and announced by our lectors prior to the weekend Masses we continue to strongly encourage (though not require) everyone to please receive Holy Communion on the hand and not on the tongue until further notice when the pandemic has subsided to a greater degree. And as Bishop O'Connell wrote in his email recommending face masks for the time being: "Thanks. Pray that this pandemic ends soon!"



Governor Murphy and Commissioner Persichilli Strongly Recommend Masking in Indoor Settings with Increased Risk

Following Wednesday, July 27's announcement by the Centers for Disease Control regarding masking, Governor Phil Murphy and New Jersey Department of Health Commissioner Judy Persichilli today strongly recommended that both vaccinated and unvaccinated residents wear masks in indoor settings when there is increased risk.

Examples of such situations include:

- Crowded indoor settings
- Indoor settings involving activities with close contact with others who may not be fully vaccinated
- Indoor settings where the vaccine status of other individuals in the setting is unknown
- Where an individual is immunocompromised or at increased risk for severe disease

Governor Murphy and Commissioner Persichilli made the following statement:

"Our metrics are trending in the wrong direction, and new data suggests the Delta variant is more transmissible even among vaccinated individuals, which is why we are making this strong recommendation. Fortunately, our numbers are a fraction of those in many other states, most of which have significantly lower vaccination rates. Should our numbers reach those levels, we reserve the right to take more drastic action, including a statewide mask mandate. We have crushed this virus repeatedly like no other state in the nation, and we are proud to boast among the country's highest vaccination rates. But at this point, given where our metrics are now, we feel the best course of action is to strongly encourage every New Jerseyan, and every visitor to our state, to take personal responsibility and mask up indoors when prudent."

"And we equally encourage every unvaccinated resident or visitor to get vaccinated. The vaccines are proven safe and highly effective, and are the surest way we can end this pandemic." (emphasis supplied)

The three "thermometers" above compare our parish's 2019 vs. 2020 vs. 2021 results-to-date in the Annual Appeal. The thermometers indicate good news. This year's total after twenty three weekends is significantly ahead of our parish's total after twenty three weekends in 2020 although lower than our parish's total after twenty three weekends in 2019. We are now more than 90% of the way to our goal! Thank you! As Saint/Mother Teresa said: "Together we can do great things!"

*This \$103,135 figure is approximately 94.6% of our parish goal. It was received as of the twenty third weekend of the campaign (tallied as of July 28) from 391 pledgers or check-writing contributors (and many unidentified, unquantified cash contributors) all of whom comprise approximately 13.5% of the 2,899 registered households of the parish. Thank you! Regarding the Latin Mass at St. Michael's Church


On July 16, 2021 Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter (*Traditionis Custodes* – available at https://www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/motu-proprio-traditionis-

custodes.html) known as a motu proprio regarding the use of the 1962 Roman Missal of Pope St. John XXIII – that refers to the celebration of the Mass in the Latin language according to the form contained in the 1962 Missal. What many refer to simply as "the Latin Mass" has been celebrated here at St. Michael's for many years and most recently since 2016 on First Fridays at 12:15 p.m. followed by Eucharistic Adoration throughout that afternoon until 5:15 and then 5:30 Mass and First Friday evening Confessions at 6:00 p.m. Bishop O'ConnI has authorized on a modified basis the continued use of the 1962 Roman Missal of Pope St. John XXIII (the celebration of "the Latin Mass") here at St. Michael's on the First Friday of alternating months (August, October, December, February, and April), On the other First Fridays of the year, our 12:15 p.m. Mass will be celebrated in the English language according to the 1970 Missal of Pope St. Paul VI as revised. We are grateful for this authorization to continue the celebration of the Latin Mass here at St. Michael's and all are invited and welcome to attend and participate.



With gratitude for all we've been given, we ask for God's continued blessings on the parishes and people of our Church family.

<u>Pastor's Note</u>. The priests of the Diocese were notified by Fr. Jason Parzynski (Director of Vocations for the Diocese of Trenton) that the recent vocations discernment event had gone well and was very well attended – the Mass and Barbecue with Bishop O'Connell on June 29 for men considering the priesthood. 
