

# Annual Summer Mission Appeal: This Weekend: August 19 and 20, 2023



This weekend, August 19 and 20, 2023, Rev. Kurt J. Klismet (Order of the Most Holy Trinity and of the Captives; O.SS.T.; the Trinitarians) will be visiting the St. Michael's parish community to share information about the ministry of the Trinitarians and to ask for your prayers and financial support for the Trinitarian mission in India. This Summer's Mission Appeal is with the permission and encouragement of our Bishop David M. O'Connell and the Trenton Diocesan Director of Missions.

Fr. Kurt has been a Trinitarian since 1996, and was ordained a priest in 2002. His hometown is Waupaca, Wisconsin. Father currently serves as Treasurer and Director of Advancement for the Order in the United States. His ministry includes assisting the Trinitarian missions in India with planning and development. The Trinitarians in India are dedicated to educating children and teens whose families are persecuted because of their faith in Christ.

Most of the Christians in the Kamrup region of India, a remote and secluded part of the country, belong to tribal communities and are often persecuted for their faith by non-Christian tribes. In this part of the world children do not have access to a proper education

due to extreme poverty and persecution. The Trinitarians in India hope to expand their ministry of Catholic education through their newly opened DeMatha English Medium School. This expansion will allow the school to add additional grade levels, dormitories for boarding students, a monastery for the religious, a playground for the younger children, and an auditorium.

The Trinitarians are hopeful that your generosity during this Mission Appeal will help them to more effectively live their school's motto, "Educate to Liberate." Please consider supporting the work of the Trinitarians in India as they continue to spread God's mercy and redemption in this remote part of the world. 








### **Parish Goal = \$109,000**

A Traditional Art and Livelihood for Holy Land Christians






## Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults
