



Regarding the Latin Mass at St. Michael's Church:

First Friday 12:15 Mass on November 5 To Be in English

On July 16, 2021 Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter (Traditionis Custodes - available at https:// www.vatican.va/content/francesco/en/motu proprio/ documents/20210716-motu-proprio-traditionis-

custodes.html) in a format known as a motu proprio regarding the use of the 1962 Roman Missal of Pope St. John XXIII – that refers to the celebration of the Mass in the Latin language according to the form contained in the 1962 Missal. What many refer to simply as "the Latin Mass" has been celebrated here at St. Michael's for many years and most recently since 2016 on First Fridays at 12:15 p.m. followed by Eucharistic Adoration throughout that afternoon until 5:15 and then 5:30 Mass and First Friday evening Confessions at 6:00 p.m. Bishop O'Connell has authorized on a modified schedule the continued use of the 1962 Roman Missal of Pope St. John XXIII (the celebration of "the Latin Mass") here at St. Michael's on the First Friday of alternating months (August, October, December, February, April, and June). On the other First Fridays of the year (September, November, January, March, May, July, and including the upcoming November 5th First Friday), our 12:15 p.m. Mass will be celebrated in the English language according to the 1970 Missal of Pope St. Paul VI as revised. We are grateful for this authorization to continue the celebration of the Latin Mass here at St. Michael's and all are invited and welcome to attend and participate. In the event of any questions, please feel free to contact one of the parish priests at the parish business office.

<u>Pastor's Note</u>. October is **Respect Life Month** as well as the month of the **Holy Rosary**. In our parish bulletin this month we are including teachings of the Church and of our Diocesan Bishop and news articles of interest on both of those subjects. That series began with a teaching document published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops to help us to know and understand more fully and to live-out more effectively the teaching of our Church on respect for human life (especially the lives of the most vulnerable in the womb) and the sinfulness of abortion. The series continues below with two news stories (excerpted and edited to fit space limitations) reporting on a speech given by Saint Mother Teresa of Calucutta in Februay 1994 at the annual National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, DC.

How Mother Teresa Challenged the Clintons on Abortion

The occasion was the annual National Prayer Breakfast, a huge ecumenical gathering in Washington. As president, Bill Clinton was a high-profile attendee....and the keynoter was a very special guest, a Nobel Peace Prize winner and saintly figure who had come all the way from the most impoverished area of the planet, the



slums of Kolkata....Near the dais were the president and first lady, along with the vice president and his wife, and a select few VIPs, including Supreme Court justices and the highest-ranking members of Congress....

Mother Teresa emerged from a curtain behind the platform only when she was called and then slowly hunched her way to the microphone....The title of Mother's talk was "Whatever You Did Unto One of the Least, You Did Unto Me." She began by talking about Jesus and John the Baptist in their wombs....She next spoke of love, of selfishness, of a lack of love for the unborn – and a lack of want of the unborn because of one's selfishness....By this point in the talk, [some of the] attendees began shifting in their seats, as a lot of what the holy lady from Kolkata had to say was


striking too close to home. Then the Sister said something that made many very uncomfortable: "But I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because Jesus said, 'If you receive a little child, you receive me.' So every abortion is the denial of receiving Jesus, the neglect of receiving Jesus"....

Then applause started on the right side of the room and then spread throughout the crowd, as people began clapping and standing; the ballroom was swept up in nonstop applause....Yet some did not clap at all....Mother Teresa continued: "By abortion, the mother does not learn to love, but kills even her own child to solve her problems. [Abortion is] really a war against the child, and I hate the killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that the mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? ... Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love one another, but to use violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion."

The little nun [in the direct presence of the President and Vice President of the United States] was doing what pro-choicers find unacceptable and might have booed out of the room if not for her moral authority. She kept describing abortion as "killing." She conclud-

ed by asking for prayers for her ministry, by asking for the blessing of God's love and by telling the 3,000 that she would pray for them and their families: "God bless you all". She then parted as she came, through the curtain behind the platform.

Parking Lot Mass to be Discontinued

The Saturday 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass that we have been celebrating in the North Parking Lot since September 11 will be discontinued. The last such parking lot Mass will be on Saturday, November 13. Beginning on November 20, the Saturday 4:00 p.m. Vigil Mass will be celebrated entirely in the Upper Church in "the normal manner". The live-streaming of the Saturday 4:00 Mass will continue.

The parking lot Mass had been resumed this past September 11 on a temporary basis with Bishop O'Connell's approval for a two-month period at a time when the covid delta variant was surging and the possibility of other high-risk variants was suspected, the school year was beginning and potential exposure to the virus was thought to be increased, vaccination numbers had not reached targeted goals, etc. Those planned-for two months will come to an end sbortly along with the arrival of the colder weather and earlier sunset/darkness (Daylight Saving Time concludes the prior Sunday, November 7) which affect the practical sustainability of the outdoor parking lot Masses.

We've been blessed to have the outdoor facilities and extremely blessed to have the volunteer manpower and womanpower here at St. Michael's that have made it possible to offer the parking lot Masses. Gratitude is extended to all the volunteers and staff members and Masses goers who have participated in the parking lot Masses since the Spring of 2020. When Mother Teresa Dared to Tell a U.S. President that Abortion is Murder

Five years after her canonization, St. Teresa of Calcutta's bold words are needed now, more than ever.



With the recent passage of a new Texas law outlawing abortion after a fetal heartbeat is detected, the issue of whether a right to abortion exists under the United States Constitution has become the subject of intense debate. It is fitting that on the fifth anniversary of her canonization, we turn to the words of Mother Teresa, who once, in the presence of a U.S. president, made the case in the most compelling way possible, that abortion – the law of the land at present in the United States – is evil.

At the National Prayer Breakfast in Washington, DC, on February 5, 1994, Mother Teresa stood before President and Mrs. Bill Clinton, and Vice President and Mrs. Al Gore, along with 4,000 others in attendance, and Mother called abortion "murder." Here is what she said:

"I feel that the greatest destroyer of peace today is abortion, because it is a war against the child, a direct killing of the innocent child, murder by the mother herself. And if we accept that a mother can kill even her own child, how can we tell other people not to kill one another? How do we persuade a woman not to have an abortion? As always, we must persuade her with love and we remind ourselves that love means to be willing to give until it hurts. Jesus gave even His life to love us. So, the mother who is thinking of abortion, should be helped to love, that is, to give until it hurts her plans, or her free time, to respect the life of her child. The father of that child, whoever he is, must also give until it hurts.

"By abortion, the mother does not learn to love, but kills even her own child to solve her problems. And, by abortion, that father is told that he does not have to take any responsibility at all for the child he has brought into the world. The father is likely to put other women into the same trouble. So abortion just leads to more abortion. Any country that accepts abortion is not teaching its people to love, but to use any violence to get what they want. This is why the greatest destroyer of love and peace is abortion."

Mother Teresa concluded her speech *with words of <u>hope</u>*, and a reminder that we are called to use our freedom for higher purposes than murder: "If we remember that God loves us, and that we can love others as He loves us, then America can become a sign of peace for the world. From here, a sign of care for the weakest of the weak - the unborn child - must go out to the world. If you become a burning light of justice and peace in the world, then really you will be true to what the founders of this country stood for. God bless you!"


