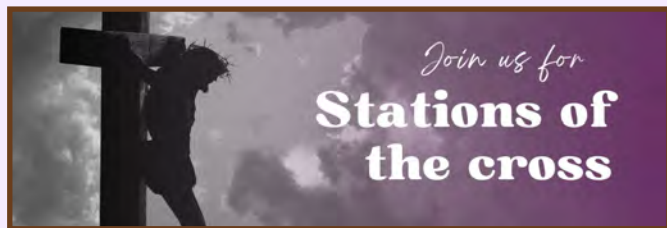

WASHINGTON - As reports emerged regarding the escalation of hostilities in the Middle East, Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, urgently called upon the United States, Iran, and the broader international community to return to dialogue and pursue every avenue toward a just and lasting peace.

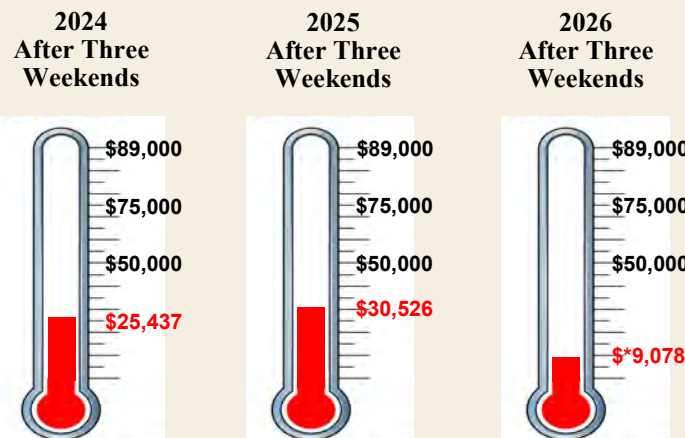
Echoing the heartfelt [appeal of Pope Leo XIV](#) to halt the spiral of violence before it becomes “an unbridgeable chasm,” Archbishop Coakley emphasized the critical need for restraint and for all parties to take concrete steps to end the conflict, work for peace and protect innocent lives. His statement follows [edited to conform to space limitations]:

“The growing conflict risks spiraling into a wider regional war...My brother bishops and I unite our voice [with our Holy Father](#) and make the heartfelt appeal to all parties involved for diplomacy to regain its proper role...At this critical moment, I invite Catholics and all people of goodwill [to continue](#) our ardent prayers for peace in the Middle East, for the safety of our troops and the innocent, that leaders may seek dialogue over destruction, and pursue the common good over the tragedy of war. The Stations of the Cross is a fourteen-step devotion that commemorates (usually with prayer, meditation, song, and artwork) certain of the events of Good Friday during His Passion and during her sorrows as she walks through Jerusalem to the Cross and to the Tomb. The Stations focus on specific events of that day, beginning with Jesus' condemnation and ending with his burial. Stations are commonly used as a form of devotion, especially during Lent days and Wednesdays. At each station, the individual moves from one station to the next, reflecting on the events and meditating on the suffering of Christ and the Blessed Mother.

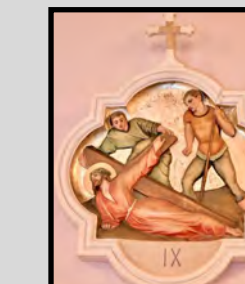

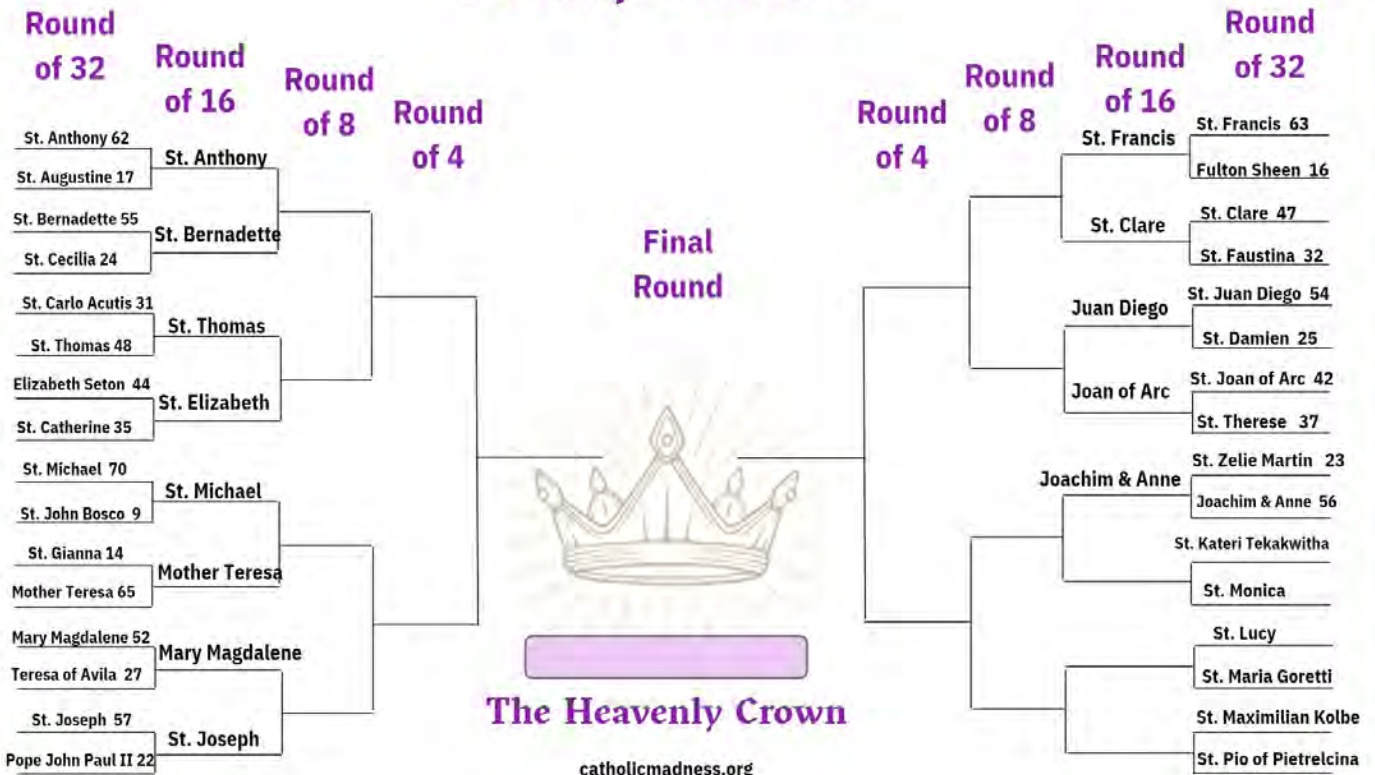

Who can receive this sacrament?

This is by no means an exhaustive list. A person may also be anointed before surgery. The Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated several times in one's lifetime.
