MARRIAGES

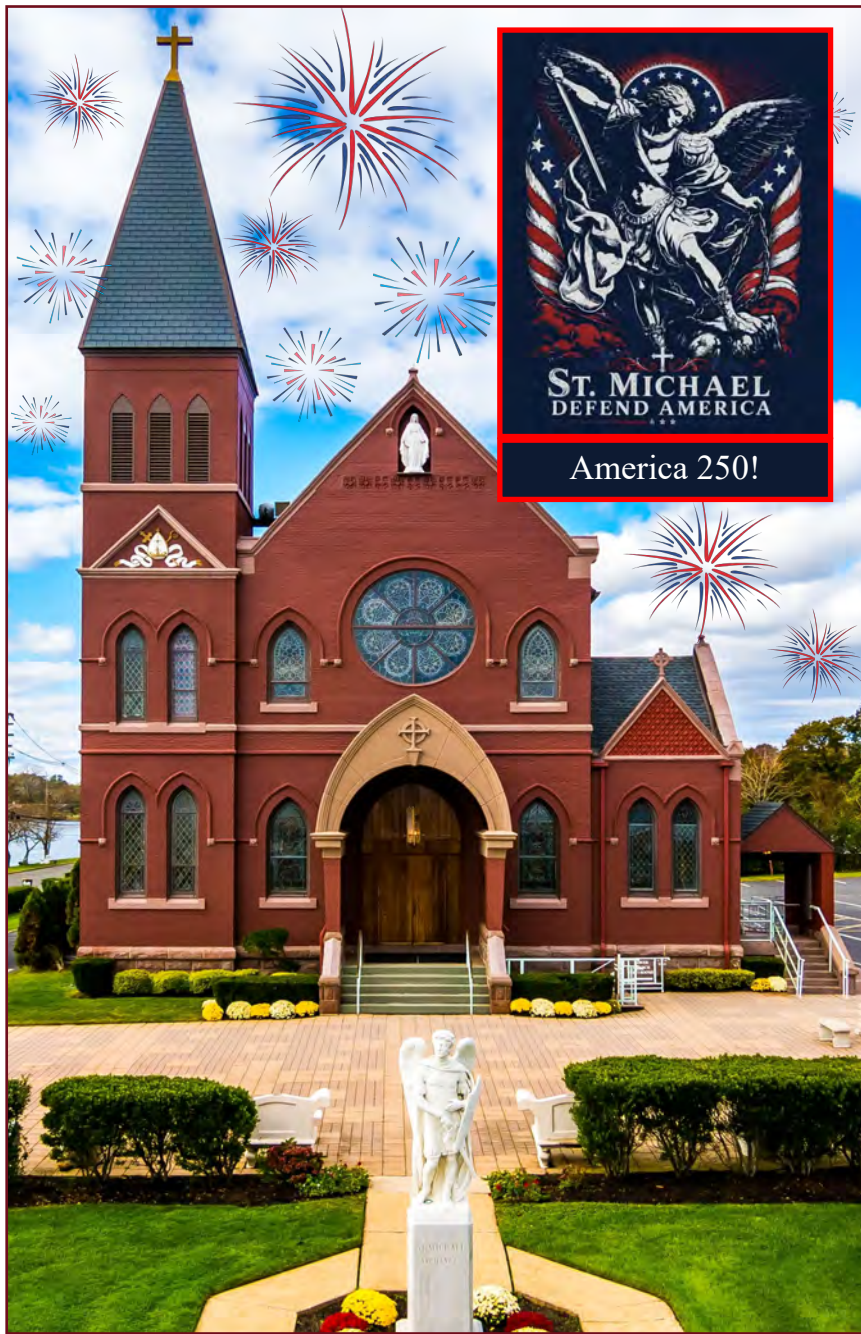

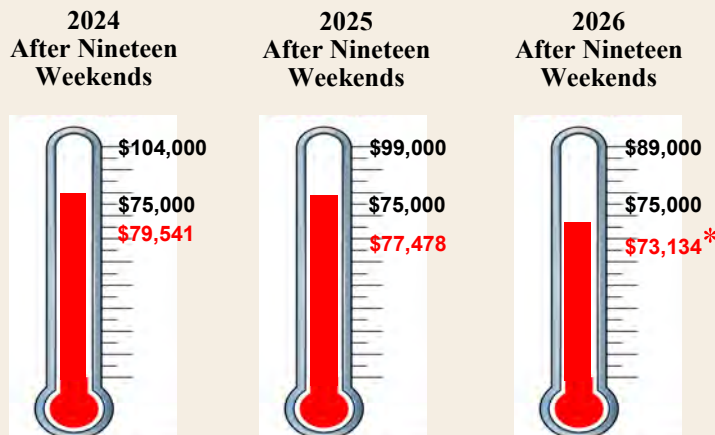

These three "thermometers" compare our parish's 2024 vs. 2025 vs. 2026 results-to-date in the Annual Catholic Appeal. The thermometers indicate a good start, that there is work ahead of us, and that we had a significant increase (nearly \$2,500) since last week. This year's

America 250! Plans at St. Michael's

As the United States of America prepares to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence on July 4, 2026, plans to celebrate this once-in-a-lifetime occasion are also progressing at St. Michael's. The plans further details will be published in the coming weeks. The anniversary events and religious services leading up to the 4th of July began here during the Memorial Day Weekend and will be continuing.



• Memorial Day Week-

• Following the conducted a Memorial Day Prayer Service in which “General Order No. 11 of the Grand Army of the Republic” read by Civil War re-enactor Larry Mihlon costumed as Union Army G.A.R. General John A. Logan. General Order No. 11 is often cited as the origin of Memorial Day and sets forth the purposes of The Day and the ceremonies for its observance.

• On Monday, May 25 at 10:00 a.m. we celebrated our parish's annual Memorial Day Mass at the Woodbine Cemetery Mausoleum to pray for all those who have died in the course of serving in our Nation's military.

• The Solemnity of Corpus Christi:

• At the conclusion of the Sunday 8:30 Mass on June 7, we had the traditional outdoor Eucharistic Procession in reverent celebration of the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Many 8:30 Mass-goers participated in the Procession from the sanctuary to the church's front lawn and back, reverently sang *O Sacrament Most Holy*, and attended the Benediction at the conclusion of the Procession.

• Flag Day Weekend:

• On Sunday, June 14 (Flag Day) the special intention of our 12:00 Noon Mass will be “God Bless America” as we honor our flag and the Republic and the freedoms for which it stands.

• An American flag was recently donated to St. Michael's by parishioner Gloria Clementi in memory of her husband Frank. The flag had been presented to Gloria during the military honors ceremony at Frank's funeral in January. Frank served in the U.S. Air Force as a Sergeant, specializing in communications. The “Clementi Flag” was raised and flown from our parish flagpole all day on this year's Flag Day and will also be raised and flown on Gloria and Frank's Wedding Anniversary, September 4.

• Religious Freedom Week:

• From Monday, June 22 to Monday, June 29 Religious Freedom Week will be sponsored by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in appreciation of and to promote religious liberty for all faiths. The week at St. Michael's will feature daily prayer and reflection focused on protecting freedom of belief and freedom of religious exercise. From the D.R.E.

Give to Caesar what belongs to Caesar, and give to God what belongs to God.

When is the last time you pondered over what it is that you owe to God? What can I actually give to Him? Of all the answers one might give, **my time** might be the best. Time to be with Him, time to love Him, time to show my gratitude, time talking with and about Him.

Regrettably, I know I spend too much time on trivial things that have no bearing on eternity. When I'm not "too busy doing something," most of my conversations with others are about favorite movies, politics, sports, good restaurants, my job, other people, and music. These may be good things, but they're not meant to eat up so much of my time. Time that I owe to God. Time that would be better utilized by being given over to God.

When the time comes for me to face Jesus, I pray that I don't know more about the trivial things than I know about Him. I hope that I don't go to Christ with a dusty, unread Bible in my hands instead of a Bible that has been frequently read and shows the wear-and-tear by its dog-eared pages, handwritten notations in the margins, underlining or highlighting of verses that have touched my heart and soul. And although Jesus will value my attendance at Mass, and the time I squeezed in for prayer, He will value even more the Masses at which I truly worshipped and adored and thanked Him from my heart; the prayer time of my day that I prioritized rather than squeezed in. Will He be comforted by how much of my daily conversation was about Him and not about the Knicks or the Yankees?

Our Heavenly Father was at the center of Jesus' life. We know this by how much time He spent in quiet prayer and in talking about Him to others. So, what does the time I spend, and the conversations I have, reveal about what's at the center of my life? Speaking for myself, it's not yet the answer it needs to be. However, as of now God is granting me the time to act now and to change my habits by putting my time in the center of His Love. May we all find the time to do so, remembering that "**my time**" is really "**God's time**" that He has lovingly shared with me as His generous gift.
